

#### 1.INTRODUCTION

User transmission will perform well, if you take care of it well. Here in this manual, we have listed critical behaviours, checks and service routine which can help you to keep things running well and avoid early failure.





#### 2.UNDERSTANDING USED TRANSMISSIONS

A used transmission is one that's been removed from a vehicle and resold. It have minor repair but will be functional, if properly cared. Mostly used transmissions come with short-term warranty, so routines maintenance will become your best protection.



### 3.INITIAL INSPECTION AFTER INSTALLATION

Once the transmission is installed:

- Check for leaks around the components.
- Verify that all the bolts are torqued correctly.
- Make sure the shifter linkage is aligned and secure.
- Confirm that fluid was filled to manufacturer specification.
- Ensure the vehicle shifts smoothly in all gears before daily use.



#### 4.REGULAR FLUID CHECK AND MAINTENANCE

Transmission fluid is very important role in maintaining the transmission.

- You must check the fluid level monthly.
- Use the premium quality fluid.
- Replace the fluid if it is burnt in color or brown in color.
- Never mix fluid types, always top off with the same type used.



### 5.SIGNS OF WEAR TO WATCH FOR

Staying alert to early warning signs can help you to prevent from major damages, such as:

- Hesitation between gear shifts
- Slipping while accelerating
- Shuddering or shaking at specific speeds
- Delayed engagement when shifting from park to drive
- Unusual noises like whining or clunking

If any of these appear, don't delay. Have the transmission checked.



### 6.TRANSMISSION FILTER AND PAN MAINTENANCE

If your transmission has a serviceable filter:

- Replace the filter every 40K miles or as advised in the vehicle's manual.
- Inspect the transmission pan after fluid change for metal particles and debris.
- Clean or replace the pan gasket if you detect any leaks.



#### 7.COOLING SYSTEM SUPPORT

Transmission fluid is cooled through the radiator or a dedicated cooler.

- Ensure your radiator and transmission cooler are clean and unclogged.
- Flush the cooling system periodically to remove debris.
- Replace any cracked or worn fluid lines immediately.
- Never bypass the transmission cooler unless recommended.

Overheating is one of the fastest ways to shorten a transmission's lifespan.

## 8.DRIVING HABITS THAT AFFECT TRANSMISSION HEALTH

How you drive directly affects transmission performance:

- Avoid rapid gear changes at high speed.
- Come to a complete stop before switching from reverse to drive.
- Limit towing or hauling heavy loads unless your vehicle is equipped for it.
- In hot weather or steep terrain, downshift manually if your vehicle allows.

Smooth, consistent driving puts less strain on components.



#### 9.SCHEDULED SERVICE **INTERVALS**

Routine

improves

longevity:

Task	Interval
Fluid Level Check	Monthly
Full Fluid Change	Every 60K miles
Filter Replacement	Every 40K miles
Cooling System Flush	Every 50K miles
Visual Leak Inspection	Every Oil Change

Always refer to the transmission manufacturer's guidelines available.



#### 10.ADDRESSING MINOR ISSUES EARLY

Don't ignore small problems. A minor leak, delayed shift, or noise might point to something that can be fixed early. Waiting too long can cause major failure or higher repair costs.

If you're not sure, consult a local transmission technician or mechanic familiar with your vehicle.



#### 11.LONG-TERM CARE REMINDERS

- Store maintenance receipts and keep a log of fluid changes.
- Keep the undercarriage clean to prevent road salt from damaging lines or seals.
- Use the parking brake consistently to reduce strain on internal components when parked.
- Avoid racing, stalling, or sudden full-throttle starts, especially in older transmissions.



#### 12.FINAL CHECKLIST AND RECORD-KEEPING

Keep this checklist handy for routine checks:

- 🧽 Transmission shifts smoothly
- No fluid leaks under vehicle
- Fluid at correct level and color
- Filter changed as scheduled
- No warning lights or codes
- Driving habits remain consistent
- Service records stored and updated



Used transmissions can last for years if given the right care. Maintenance doesn't have to be complex, but it should be consistent. This manual is designed to help you protect your investment and reduce the chance of unexpected breakdowns.
